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Ron Jenning's Zenith 701 STOL

On Saturday, May 26, several Chapter 21 members visited the home and workshop of Ron Jennings, to see the Zenith 701 he has under construction there. His airplane, on the gear, but without the wings or vertical tail, is in his two-car garage.

"How this choice of plane came about," Ron explained, "is, a guy in Atlanta Georgia who

stayed at Mike Zeller's house one night came up to buy another airplane I built, and I stayed in contact with him. This was 2004, I guess. So he built the low-wing model of this Zenith plane. It looks like a little Piper Cherokee. I called to question him about what he liked about his plane. He said 'I wish it landed slower, and I don't need a plane that goes that fast'. He said 'If I were you, I'd go over and look at this 701. You'd get a lot more use




out of it.' I wanted a plane that landed slow, preferably five miles an hour. But I believe this plane will land about 15 miles per hour in a 10 mile per hour headwind. Or slower. It's amazing. When you go to the factory and get a test ride, Roger—he's a test pilot over there [Mexico, MO]—he went out to the end of the runway, but he turned the plane across

the runway, to show you the takeoff ability. He doesn't get grass on the tires. It's off the ground across the width of the runway."

When asked what color he is going to paint it, he said: "This is it. This is the color it's going to be. I'm going to put some decals on it, but I'm not going to paint it. It's going to be called the 'Grasshopper.' I'm going to have Jiminy Cricket on the rudder."







He built the panel himself. "It's burled veneer." he said, "I stained it, and put about eight coats of polyurethane varnish on it."

Ultralight Fly-In at the Lawrenceville-Vincennes Ultralight Airpark June 16, 2007. 1000' turf runway. Pilots sign in 8am. Free coffee and donuts for fly-in pilots. Auto gas available. Flying Skills Contests (start at 10am): Precision landing and bag/target drop. \$ reward for winner.

The actual fly-in is at the **Ultralight Field** on the South side of the airport. It has a 1000' runway. I doubt if the faster GA planes could land there safely. Young Eagles Day—July 7, 2007

The requirements to be a Young Eagle Pilot are the same as before. Basically, you must be a current EAA National Member, be current in your airplane, (I can help you if you need a BFR!) and aircraft passenger liability insurance is required. There is no specific minimum.



As an EAA Member, participating in the Young Eagles Program, you will be eligible for an additional \$1 Million of Passenger Liability if you carry a minimum of \$100,000 per seat liability, but that is not specifically a requirement.
